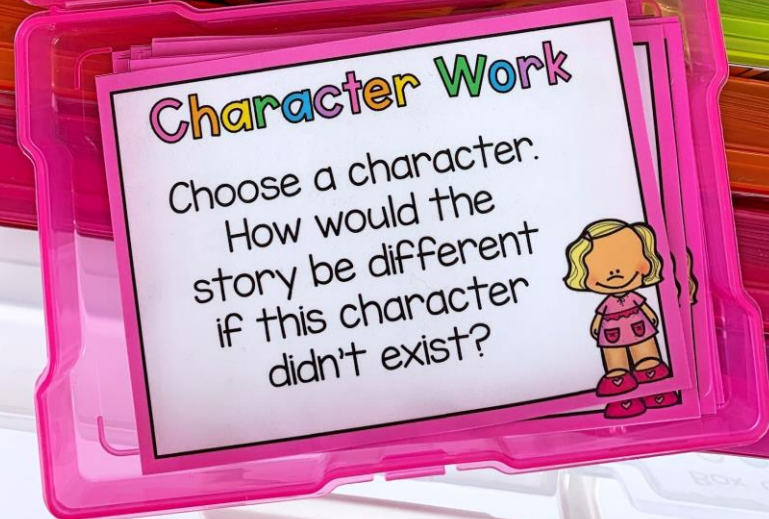
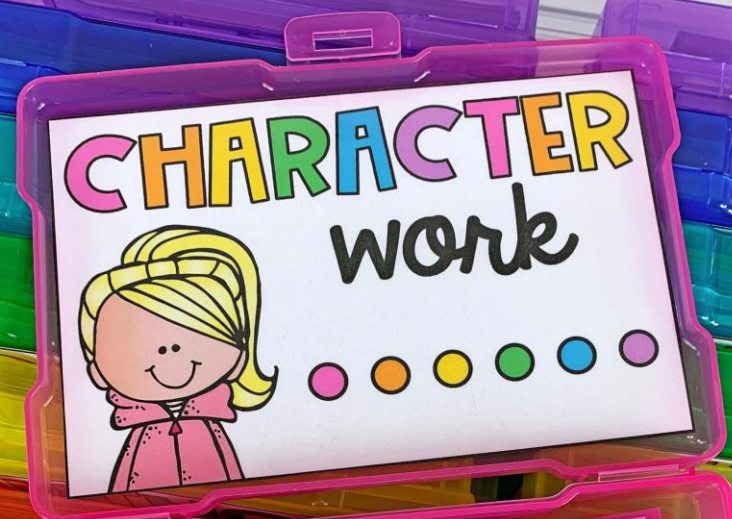
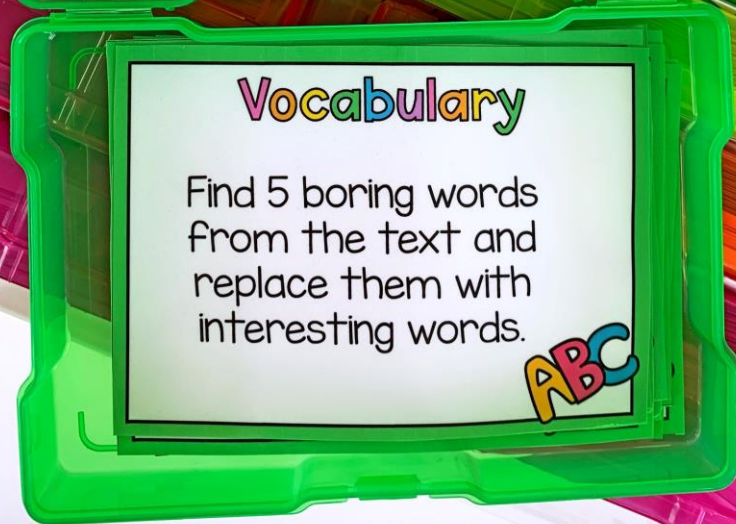
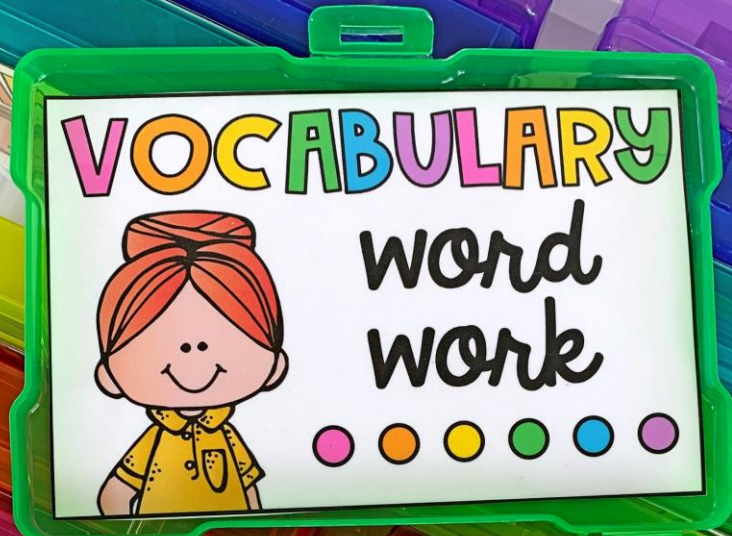
It helps to develop students' comprehension skills as well as helping to refine their reading strategies.



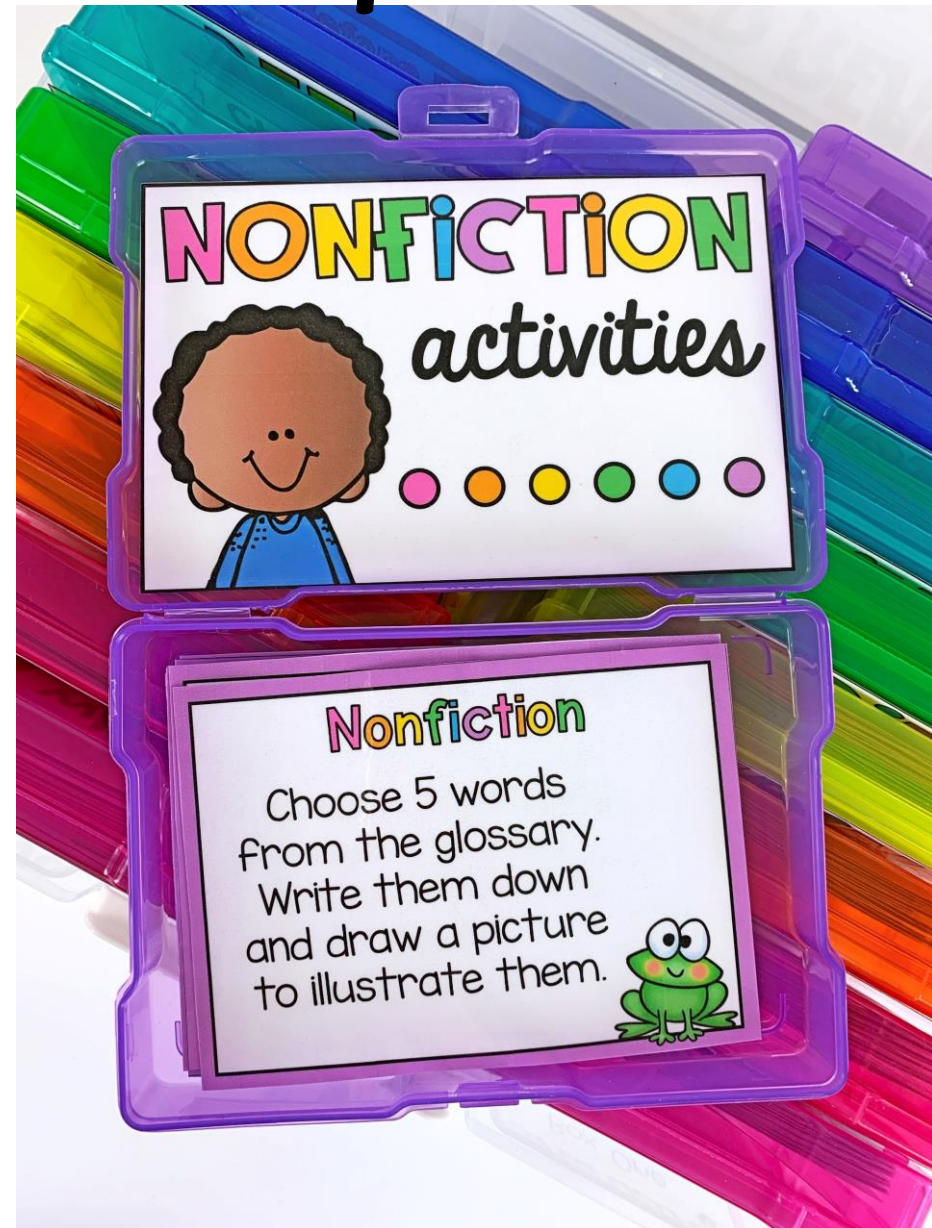
Task boxes included:

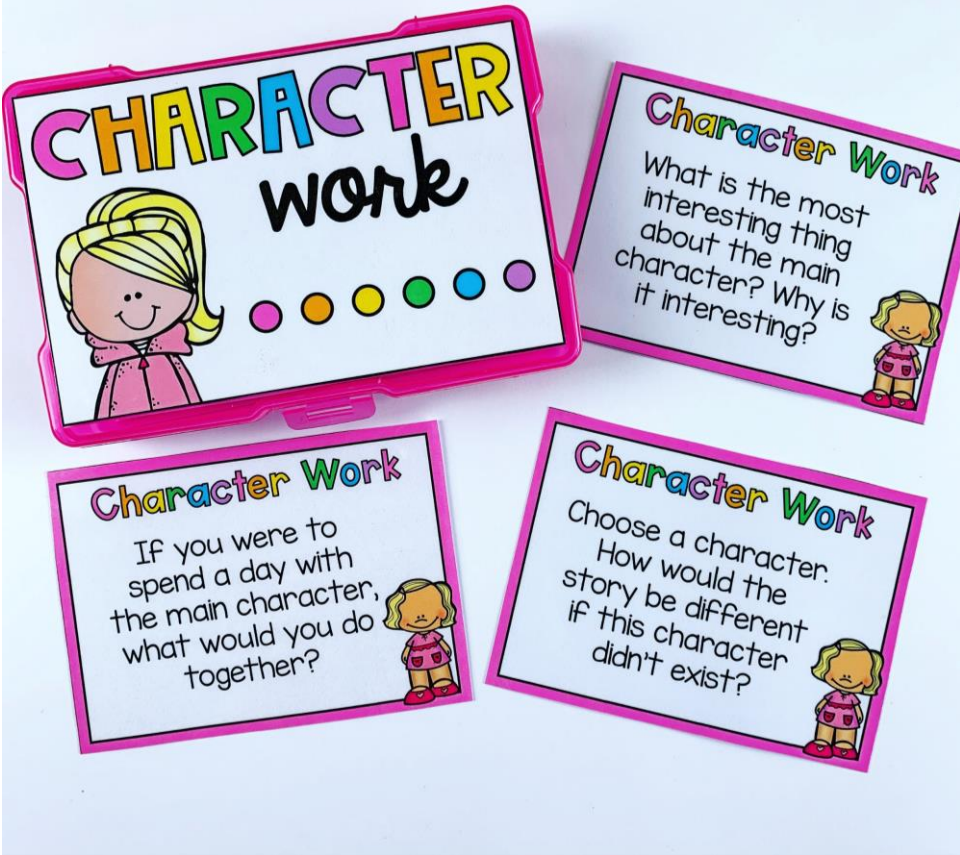

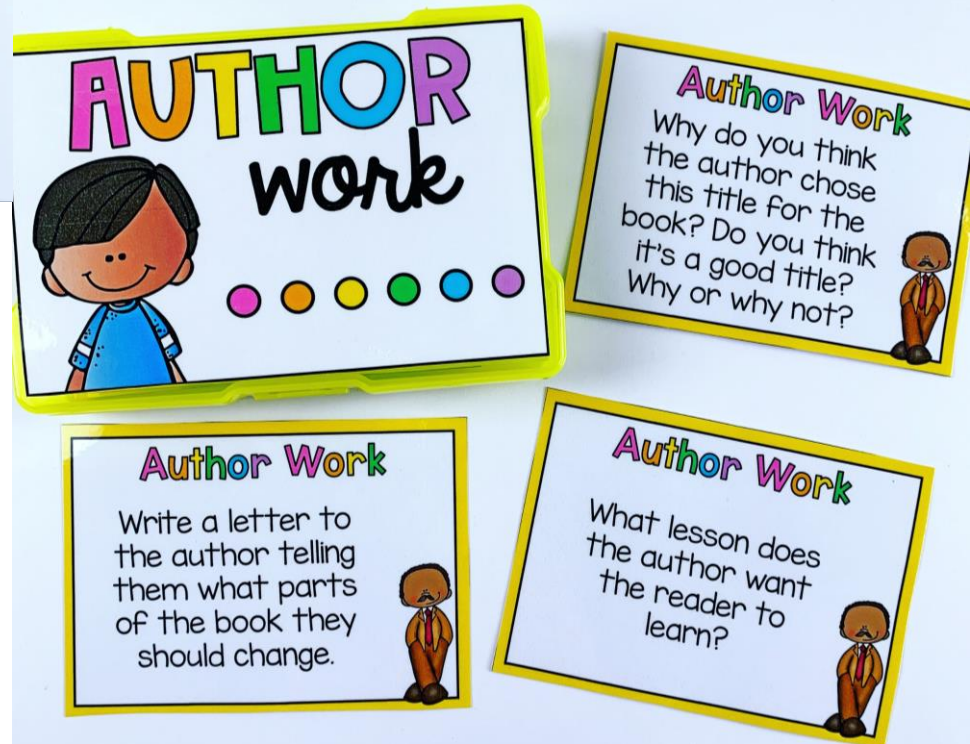

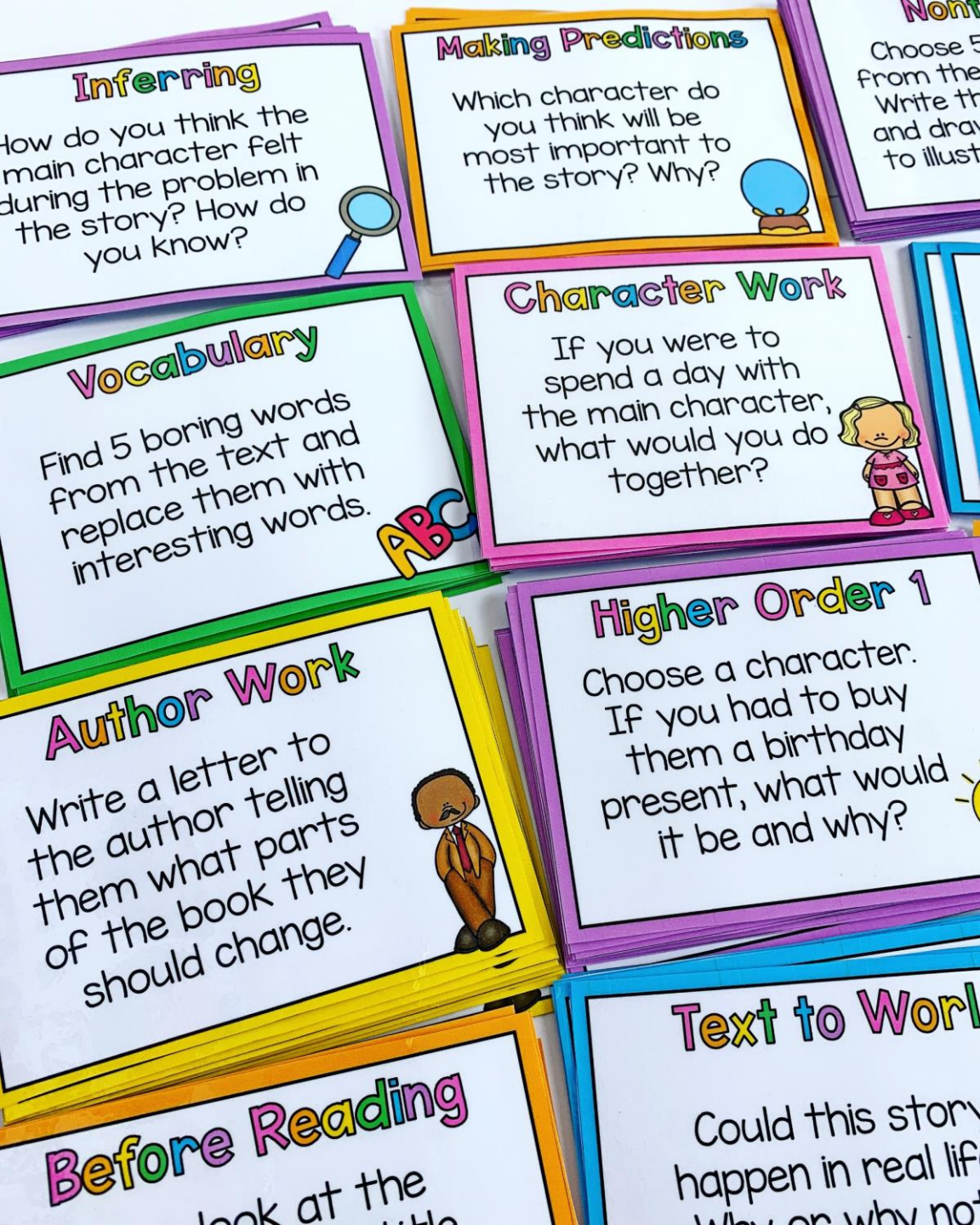


The activities require no prep or worksheets. Students simply respond to the task in their writing books.
